The Bay Area Senior Games and the 2012 California State Championships are conducted under the auspices of the Bay Area Sports Organizing Committee (BASOC). The Bay Area Senior Games were held in 2006, 2007 and 2008 as "test events" for the 2009 Summer National Senior Games and in 2010 and 2011, recognized as a "legacy" event in recognition of the successful 2009 Summer National Senior Games.

The CSGA's mission is to promote healthy lifestyles for seniors through education, fitness and the spirited competition of sports, while inspiring everyone to embrace health and appreciate and enjoy the value of sports related exercise.

In 2012 eight regional Senior Games competitions will take place around the state. Sites for regional Senior Games include San Diego, San Diego North County, Inland Empire, Pasadena, Palm Desert, San Francisco Bay Area, and Santa Rosa.
